

“Taking What We Have To Make What We Need”

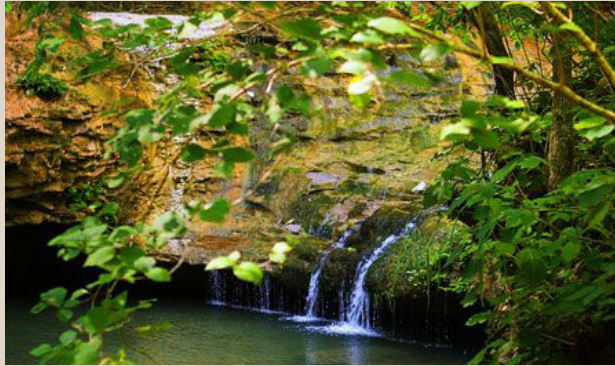

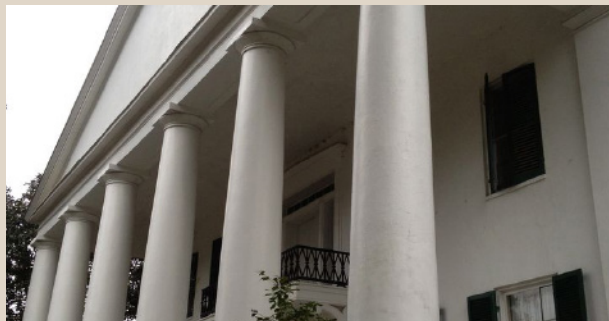

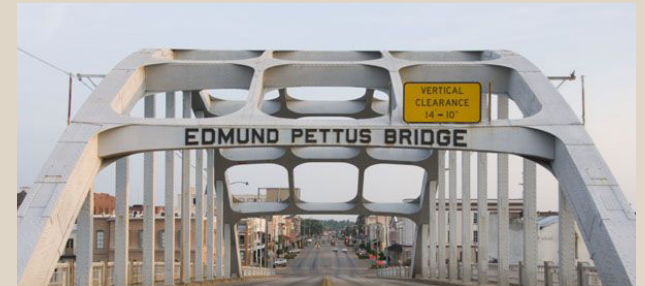
